1890's Stained Glass Window Restoration

Our museum is home to many artifacts that preserve and share the fascinating history of the Nunda area. These treasures come in all shapes and sizes, but one stands out for its beauty and compelling story. With your support, a stunning 19th-century stained glass window from Nunda's First Presbyterian Church can once again shine as a symbol of our community's rich heritage.



The First Presbyterian Church pictured here was actually the second church built by the congregation near the corner of East and Church Streets. Their first church, completed in 1834, was sold to the Methodists about a dozen years later and moved across East Street to its present location. The Presbyterians then built a new church, dedicated in 1847. According to *Churches in the Town of Nunda and Vicinity* by Hope DePuy and Sally Hall, memorial windows were added during a major renovation in 1890. This particular window was dedicated to an early church elder, Abram (Abraham) Burgess.

When the church was razed in 1979, the church windows were sold at public auction. For more than 40 years this window was stored in a local barn, until it was generously donated to the Nunda Historical Society in 2022.

Restoration of this historic window will be expertly handled by Mr. Dennis Kenney of

Selective Stained Glass in Warsaw, NY. With nearly 50 years of experience restoring stained glass for homes, businesses, and churches, Mr. Kenney will clean and repair the window, ensuring it is structurally sound and ready for display. Once completed, it will be mounted and lighted on an interior wall in our Nunda Museum.

The total cost of this project, including the restoration and mounting, is estimated at \$2,000. Your contribution will help make this restoration possible! An Important Technology Upgrade

While the NHS remains dedicated to preserving the past, we must also look to the future. For years, we have used technology to support our mission of collecting, preserving, interpreting, presenting, and promoting our area's history. Our Facebook page and website are just two examples, along with virtual meetings and online programs like the one planned for May 2025.

Behind the scenes, computers play a vital role in record-keeping, communication, and projects such as transcribing records and diaries, scanning photographs, and expanding digital access to the materials in our collection. We have also been working to digitize thousands of handwritten accession records of artifacts. However, all three NHS computers and their software were more than a decade old, limiting our efficiency.

Last fall, the NHS Board approved a much-needed technology upgrade. With the expertise of Brian Gordinier of One Stop Tech Shop in Geneseo, we purchased new equipment and updated our software. These improvements will allow multiple volunteers to work on digitizing accession records and other key projects. This upgrade was made possible thanks to generous donations from our members and memorial contributions.

Nunda Village Historic District Officially Listed on the National Register of Historic Places

If you've been following along and attending the public meetings, you know that the Village of Nunda and The Landmark Society of Western NY have been working toward a significant milestone: listing the Nunda Village Historic District on the National Register of Historic Places. We are thrilled to announce that as of February 2025, the district has officially been listed!



What does this mean for property owners?

The National Register listing is honorary, recognizing the historic significance of Nunda's architecture, development, and cultural heritage. Importantly, it does not place any restrictions on private property owners unless state or federal funding or permitting is involved. Instead, it serves as a point of pride for the community while also offering access to valuable financial incentives.

Historic Tax Credit Benefits

One of the most significant advantages of this designation is that property owners may now qualify for historic tax credit programs, which provide financial assistance for maintaining and rehabilitating historic buildings.

The NYS Historic Homeownership Tax Credit Program offers a 20% state income tax credit on qualified expenses for repair, maintenance, and rehabilitation work. To be eligible: (1) the property must be owner-occupied, (2) located within a qualified census tract (Nunda is!), (3) incur at least \$5,000 in total eligible expenditures, and (4) work must be approved prior to starting.

Income-producing property owners may be eligible for the <u>State and Federal Historic Tax Credit Programs</u>. The state program piggybacks off the federal program and offers a 20-30% state income tax credit, while the federal program offers a 20% federal income tax credit on qualified expenses. This means that income-producing properties could receive up to 50% in total tax credits for qualified rehabilitation projects. To learn more, visit: parks.ny.gov/shpo/tax-credit-programs.
